### B. Middle School Career Technical Education Waiver

St. Bernard-Elmwood Place City School District will not provide middle school career technical programming to 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students during the 2023-2024 school year.

### C. Resolution Declaring Transportation Impractical

#### RESOLUTION DECLARING TRANPORTATION IMPRACTICAL

WHEREAS, the Superintendent for the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place City School District has received a request for transportation for students enrolled in the District, a nonpublic or community school, or the joint vocational school; and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent has determined the listed students eligible but impractical to transport by public conveyance; and

WHEREAS, the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place City School District Board of Education (hereafter the "Board") has carefully considered transportation options for the eligible students listed in Exhibit A under Ohio Revised Code Section 3327.01; and

WHEREAS, for each of the students listed, the Board has considered the following factors as enumerated in R.C. §3327.02:

- 1) The time and distance required to provide the transportation;
- 2) The number of pupils to be transported;
- 3) The cost of providing transportation in terms of equipment, maintenance, personnel and administration;
- 4) Whether similar or equivalent service is provided to other pupils eligible for transportation;
- 5) Whether and to what extent the additional service unavoidably disrupts current transportation schedules; and
- 6) Whether other reimbursable types of transportation are available.

WHEREAS, the option of offering payment in lieu of transportation is provided by the Ohio Revised Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place City School District Board of Education as follows:

#### Section 1

After fully and carefully considering each of the factors listed above, the Board hereby affirms the determination that it is impractical to transport the students listed in Exhibit A for the 2023-2024 school year, and further hereby offers the parent(s)/guardian(s) payment in lieu of transportation. This decision was reached after considering the factors enumerated in R.C. §3327.02. Required reports will be made as directed by the Ohio Department of Education.

#### Section 2

The Board of Education finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the adoption of this resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board of Education, and that all deliberations of this Board of Education and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to

the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22.

#### Section 3

This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and immediately after its adoption and shall supersede any prior resolution or act of this Board of Education that may be inconsistent or duplicative with the provisions of this resolution.
